



## Bed Class

### Step 1

Add the **Bed Class** in the vacancy name field when appropriate.

**Format:** Floor A-Room A-Bed 3 **Class B**



Long-Term Care Home beds structural classifications

Bed Class	Definition
“New”	Meet the design standards set out in the LTC Facility Design Manual, 1999 (LTCFDM), 2002 The Retrofit Design Manual, January 2002, the LTC Home Design Manual (2009 or 2015).
“A”	Beds which substantially meet the requirements of the design standards described in the LTCFDM. Full compliance with every aspect of the LTCFDM will not necessarily be met in all cases.
“B”	Beds which well exceed the 1972 regulated nursing home structural standards, but fall short of the LTCFDM.
“C”	Beds which meet the 1972 nursing home structural standards. Some Category “C” which have some structural features that exceed the 1972 structural standards.
Upgraded “D”	Beds which under the D bed Upgrade Program, invested a minimum of \$3,500 per bed in the home and upgrade certain targeted areas of direct benefit to residents but do not meet the “C” classification.
“D”	Beds which do not meet compliance with the 1972 nursing home structural standards.

Add the **RPAB** text in the vacancy name field when appropriate.

**Format:** Floor A-Room A-Bed 3 **RPAB**
